Overview

Goals

- 1. Prepare for the CCNA
 - a. This is probably my primary goal for this semester. I know that I am required to get the CCNA and the CCNP certifications upon starting my job. Miguel at Cisco informed my that I will be very highly respected in my field if I also take the CCIE.
